<p>Interview a person older than 65 and write a paper describing his or her life. It should have 3 sections: personal/family life, school, and career.</p>	<p>Plan a meal for 4 people. Include recipes/directions and grocery list. You have a \$50 budget for this meal. You do not have to make the meal but if you do, take pictures, and include in your recipe/ingredients page.</p>	<p>God's Love for Us- Devotional (Attached) Read daily readings and write in a journal (or lined paper). Write a quick summary of the daily reading and how you felt about it. How does it show God's love for us? What does it teach us about God's love?</p>	<p>Use materials to protect a water balloon from popping. Take a picture of your final product. Then go outside and test it by throwing it against a wall or tree. Improve your design and try again!</p>	<p>Memorize the 50 States and their Capitols. (Tip: look on Youtube to find fun songs to learn them). Choose a state and complete the fact sheet. (See attachments)</p>
<p>Keep a health journal for 2 weeks. List the healthy things that you did for your body each day. Include all your food, exercise, how much sleep you had, what you did that made you happy, and what you did that made others happy.</p>	<p>Go to the farmers market or local supermarket. Write a list of how many kinds of fruit you can purchase with \$30. You do not have to buy them! (Try to stay within the budget!)</p>	<p>"God Loves Me" Mobile. Cut a 12 inch circle of cardboard. Use string or ribbon to hang 10-15 pictures, words, or drawings to show what God loves about you.</p>	<p>Build a raft from aluminum foil. Fill a large bowl, sink or tub with water place your raft. Make sure it floats. Now add coins to the raft one by one. How many coins can it hold before it sinks? Improve on your design and try to increase the amount of coins for your next raft. Take a picture of your experiment.</p>	<p>Choose a sport. Write directions and rules about how to play the sport for someone who has never seen it or heard of it. Include diagrams or pictures.</p>
<p>Write an autobiography. (At least 2-3 paragraphs)</p>	<p>Take a walk in your neighborhood. List 20 different ways how you see math is used in everyday life. Use complete sentences to describe what you see and how it is used. Take pictures or draw what you saw.</p>	<p>Read Matthew 5:1-12 in the Bible. Illustrate each Beatitude on printer paper (1 Beatitude per page). Make sure to color neatly.</p>	<p>Search newspapers or the internet for 5 interesting AND current stories about science. Summarize the articles on lined paper (Summary: 5-8 sentences).</p>	<p>Research online about a Native American tribe. As if you were a part of the tribe, write 5 journal entries about your daily life.</p>
<p>Read a chapter book. Complete a book report (attached)</p>	<p>Use graph paper (attached) and design the first floor of your dream home. Make sure to include all necessary rooms and make it proportional!</p>	<p>Choose a Saint. Research the Saint's life and work. Make an informational poster on copy paper. Draw the saint and write at least 5 facts about the Saint.</p>	<p>Use items you would throw away or recycle and make something useful out of it. Name your product, set a price and create a slogan to sell it. Take a picture of your product or you can show me your product in class</p>	<p>Read a non-fiction book. 
